# Collaboration

- Continuing Professional Development (CPD) is essential to ensure delivery of high quality care and for patient safety.

### Next steps

Evaluation is in its early stages and ongoing.

- However, students have been purchasing the e-book and its use has been apparent in formative and summative reference lists.
- Students find the book easy to navigate and it is clear they have undertaken wider reading, using the book as a resource.

- Compiling and evaluating student feedback
