## Publication of Thesis

University regulations require the submission of an electronic copy of your thesis before your degree can be awarded. This will be deposited in the Buckinghamshire New University repository from where it will be harvested into the British Library EThOS E-Theses Online Service. This will provide visibility of your research via the internet.

## Copyright

You should make every effort to seek permission to include any third party copyright material in the electronic version of your thesis. This includes illustrations such as maps, photographs, images diagrams etc copied from another publication for which you will need written permission from the copyright owner.

It is possible to make an edited version for deposit which excludes the third party material in which case the material should be removed and replaced with a statement e.g. 'this photograph has been removed by the author for copyright reasons'.

## Restricted access to your thesis

In exceptional circumstances, your thesis may contain material that should remain confidential:

- Your sponsor/employer may require that your thesis not be generally available;
- There may be a patent pending;
- There may be other reasons why access to your thesis should be restricted

Under these circumstances you may request for your thesis to have restricted access (ie placed under embargo) for a period of up to two years.

Nevertheless, if the University receives a request under the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act 2000 to disclose information in your thesis, it might be required to comply with that request unless an FOI exemption can be claimed. These exemptions cover such matters as the intention to publish the information in the future (maybe via a patent), or confidentiality agreements, or commercial interests.
